PALESTINE ACTION TARGET THE LONDON-BASED LANDLORDS OF KENT'S ISRAELI WEAPONS FACTORY

During the early hours of Thursday 29th May, activists from Palestine Action targeted the London-based landlords of 'Discovery Park' business park which Elbit's Instro Precision weapons factory is situated in. The registered address of Discovery Park Ltd was covered in red paint and the front windows were shattered, to demonstrate against the company's involvement in arming the Gaza genocide.

Instro Precision is a weapons maker owned by Elbit Systems, Israel's biggest weapons producer. The factory, which produces targeting gear for the Israeli military to commit genocide, is based in and leased by Discovery Park Ltd.

In 2024, according to recent FOI disclosures, Instro Precision was granted over a dozen weapons export licenses for the shipment of arms to Israel. Most of the goods exported to Israel by Instro fall under category 'ML5b' (target acquisition and related systems). Instro's products include SpectroXR imaging systems for Israel's *Skylark* drones, while Elbit has boasted that thousands of the 'XACT' weapons sights systems manufactured by Instro have been delivered to the Israeli military and are most likely used to massacre Palestinians.

Palestine Action's direct action campaign involves targeting all those who facilitate, enable and profit from the operations of Israel's biggest weapons producer. This includes landlords, recruiters, investors, suppliers, lobby firms, logistics firms and more. As a result, over a dozen companies have cut ties with Elbit to date.





Activists from Palestine Action targeted CDW, tech suppliers for Israel's biggest weapons manufacturer, Elbit Systems, in an anonymous, covert action at their Peterborough premises today. Glass panels were cracked and the building was covered in red paint, symbolising the bloodshed of the Palestinian people. This is not the first time Palestine Action has targeted the firm, having previously hit their London, Manchester and Peterborough offices. The action comes as part of Palestine Action's continued commitment to targeting the supply chains used by Elbit Systems.

CDW provide supply chain management, IT solutions, cyber security and eProcurement services for the Israeli weapons maker, making Elbit's deadly business more efficient. This action highlights the company's role in the genocide of the Palestinian people and urges CDW to end its ties with Elbit.

Since October 7th, over 54,000 Palestinians have been killed, more than 123,000 injured and the majority of the people in Gaza are now displaced and still subjected to brutal bombardment. Elbit Systems supply the majority of Israel's military drone fleet, land based equipment, bullets, munitions and missiles. Their weaponry is often marketed as "battle-tested", after it's deployed and experimented on the people of Gaza and before it's sold on to other regimes across the world. The genocide of Gaza would not be possible without Elbit's weaponry and those who facilitate and profit from their deadly business.

A Palestine Action spokesperson said:

"Palestine Action continues to target all those who enable the operations of Israel's biggest weapons producer, Elbit Systems.



Under cover of darkness, a Palestine Action team cut through fences and broke into Permoid Industries of Newton Aycliffe near Durham, entering the factory to destroy machinery, weaponry and remove private documents.

Since the start of the Gaza Genocide in October 2023, Permoid have shipped more than a thousand munitions containers to the Israeli arms industry, at least 920 of which went to Israel's biggest weapons maker, Elbit Systems, in Ramat Hasharon near Tel Aviv. Permoid produces a wide range of weapons and ammunition containers, suitable for belted heavy machine-gun ammunition, and cartridge, mortar, and shell munitions, including 155mm artillery shells. At the time of the raid by Palestine Action, another shipment was due to be picked up from the factory.


Elbit Systems supplies up to 85% of the Israeli military's killer drone fleet, and land-based military equipment, with numerous weapons factories in Britain. The Ramat Hasharon site produces a range of armaments, including artillery shells, and 155mm and 122mm mortar rounds. Elbit's weapons and ammunition has been central to the Genocide perpetrated by Israel in Gaza.



PALESTINE ACTION RETURN TO PERMOID INDUSTRIES, OCCUPYING THE ROOF AND SHUTTING THE FACTORY DOWN

Only 48 hours after launching a daring raid on Permoid Industries of Newton Aycliffe near Durham, Palestine Action have returned to occupy the roof of the factory ahead of a planned shipment of ammunition boxes to Israeel.

In the early hours of Saturday morning, a team of Palestine Action activists cut through perimeter fencing and entered the factory, smashing machinery and weaponry, covering it in blood-red paint, and removing confidential documents from the site. The paint was barely dry when Palestine Action were back to refresh it, once more evading security, and this time scaling the roof to unfurl banners exposing Permoid's part in the Gaza Genocide. From the roof, activists today created holes to further damage the inside of the site. The factory has been shut down.

Since October 2023, while Palestinian civilians have been murdered by the thousand, Permoid have been busy making money, assisting the Israeli military, shipping out over a thousand ammunition containers. At least 920 of these containers went to the Ramat Hasharon weapons factory of Elbit Systems, Israel's biggest arms company, with a further 160 containers going to Elbit's 'Advanced Technology Centre' in Haifa.

Permoid manufacture a wide range of weapons and ammunition containers, suitable for everything from grenades and heavy machine-gun ammunition, to mortar and shell munitions, including 155mm artillery shells. Permoid's customer, Elbit Systems, supplies up to 85% of the Israeli military's killer drone fleet, and land-based military equipment, with numerous weapons factories in Britain. The Ramat Hasharon

site, near Haifa, produces a range of armaments, including artillery shells, and 155mm and 122mm mortar rounds. Elbit's weapons and ammunition has been central to the Genocide in Gaza.


A spokesperson for Palestine Action said: "Permoid have been making blood money supplying Israel's biggest weapons firm, during the Gaza Genocide. Now their dirty secret is out, we will target them like any other Genocide-complicit company, something underlined by our return visit today. We advise them to immediately cut their ties to Elbit, and stop assisting in the slaughter of Palestinian civilians. If they continue, we will do everything we can to put them out of business."

PALESTINE ACTION DAMAGE MILITARY PLANES AT RAF BRIZE NORTON TO INTERVENE IN THE GENOCIDE

Jun 20, 2025

Palestine Action have damaged two military planes at RAF Brize Norton, where flights leave daily for RAF Akrotiri in Cyprus, a base used for military operations in Gaza and across the Middle East. Two activists broke into the largest air force base in Britain and used electric scooters to swiftly manoeuvre towards the planes. They used repurposed fire extinguishers to spray red paint into the turbine engines of two Airbus Voyagers and caused further damage using crowbars. Red paint, symbolising Palestinian bloodshed was also sprayed across the runway and a Palestine flag was left on the scene. Both activists managed to evade security and arrest.

By putting the planes out of service, activists have interrupted Britain's direct participation in the commission of genocide and war crimes across the Middle East. From Akrotiri, the RAF have flown hundreds of surveillance missions in support of Israel's genocide in Gaza [1], and the base is also used for UK and US military cargo transports to the Israeli military [2]. In a speech to troops at Akrotiri in December 2024, Keir Starmer hailed the troops' efforts while stating that "Quite a bit of what goes on here can't necessarily be talked about [...] we can't necessarily tell the world what you're doing" [3]. By this point, Israel had massacred tens of thousands in Gaza, the Akrotiri base had been used to collected up-to 1,000 hours of reconnaissance footage over the Strip in assistance of Israel [4].

The targeted planes are Airbus Voyagers, which can carry military cargo and are used to refuel Israeli/US/UK military aircrafts and fighter jets. Previously, such Voyagers were used to refuel RAF Typhoon aircraft and US military planes for bombing runs against Yemen [5], where combined US-UK-Israeli airstrikes have killed hundreds of Yemenis [6][7]. Recently, British Airbus Voyagers have been seen flying over Jordan, Iraq and towards Syria, where they stop to refuel Israeli or US fighter jets for 4-5 hours and then return to Akrotiri.

From the military base, Airbus Atlas flights also travel to RAF Akrotiri. Atlas flights can carry soldiers, guns, ammunition, bombs and munitions. During the escalating genocide in Gaza, the British military have flown Atlas flights from Akrotiri to Tel Aviv, carrying soldiers and/or military cargo [8].

RAF Brize Norton, where the aircrafts are now grounded, has also played host to numerous Israel Air Force transport flights within recent months [9].



Security review launched after activists break into RAF base



Watch: BBC looks at how activists breached RAF base Brize Norton

A security review has been launched across UK military bases after pro-Palestinian activists broke into RAF Brize Norton and sprayed two military planes with red paint.

Prime Minister Sir Keir Starmer condemned the action as "disgraceful", saying it was an "act of vandalism".

Footage posted online by Palestine Action on Friday showed two people inside the Oxfordshire airbase in darkness, with one riding on a scooter up to an Airbus Voyager and spraying paint into its jet engine.

South East counter terrorism police later confirmed its specialist officers were investigating the incident alongside Thames Valley Police and the Ministry of Defence (MoD).

Downing Street said the incident had not blocked any planned aircraft movements or stopped any operations.

Defence Secretary John Healey said he was "really disturbed" by the incident and had ordered an investigation and the wider security review.

Palestine Action said the activists evaded security and claimed they had put the air-to-air refuelling tankers "out of service".

However, RAF engineers are assessing the damage and a defence source told the BBC they did not expect the incident to affect operations.

In a statement, a Palestine Action spokesperson said: "Despite publicly condemning the Israeli government, Britain continues to send military cargo, fly spy planes over Gaza and refuel US and Israeli fighter jets."

Counter-terror police said the incident happened in the early hours of Friday and added enquiries were "ongoing to establish the exact circumstances".

Thames Valley Police earlier said it had received a report about people gaining access to the base and causing criminal damage.

"Inquiries are ongoing to locate and arrest those responsible," the force said.

Palestine Action has engaged in similar activity since the start of the current war in Gaza, predominantly targeting arms companies. In May, it claimed responsibility for the daubing of a US military plane in Ireland.

The group said the activists who entered RAF Brize Norton used repurposed fire extinguishers to spray red paint into the planes' engines.

It also said they caused "further damage" using crowbars - though this is not visible in the bodycam footage it provided.

Video shows the activists then roaming around the airbase.

The protesters did not spray paint on the Vespina aircraft - used by the prime minister for international travel - which was also on the base.

The MoD told the BBC that RAF Voyager aircraft had not been involved in refuelling or supporting Israeli Air Force jets.

A spokesman said Voyagers have been used in the Middle East to refuel RAF Typhoon jets involved in the ongoing international efforts to tackle the so-called Islamic State group in eastern Iraq and Syria.

They have also been used in the Red Sea in the past in operations against Yemen's Houthi rebels.

Lord West, Labour minister for UK security and former head of the Royal Navy, said earlier that while he was not aware of the full details, the break-in was "extremely worrying".

"We can't allow thing like this to happen at all," he told BBC Radio 4's Today programme, adding that breaches like it were "really a problem" for national security.

Conservative leader Kemi Badenoch said the security breach was "deeply concerning".

"This is not lawful protest, it is politically motivated criminality," she said in a statement.

Greg Bagwell - a former RAF deputy commander - said that in targeting the Voyager, the activists picked "a strange target".

Air Marshall Bagwell, now a distinguished fellow at the Royal United Services Institute (Rusi), told the BBC "those aircraft do not do what these protesters think they do. They're largely used for moving passengers or fuel".

He added that Voyagers had "the wrong connectors" that would stop them being used to help refuel Israeli or US jets, as the action group suggested.

But he said if the activists "wanted to create an effect, they've clearly done that".

Shadow armed forces minister Mark Francois told the BBC any attempt to interfere with the engines of large aircraft was "totally reprehensible".

He added there were "serious questions for the MoD to answer" about how protesters were able to "gain access to what is supposed to be a secure RAF airbase".

The local Liberal Democrat MP Charlie Maynard described the activists' actions as "stupid and dangerous".

He said the investigations should establish "how this happened and what can be done in future to make sure no further breaches occur".

Four arrested after RAF Brize Norton break-in

Counter-terror police have arrested four people after military planes were sprayed with paint during a break-in at RAF Brize Norton that was claimed by a pro-Palestinian group.

Footage posted online last Friday by Palestine Action showed two people inside the Oxfordshire airbase in darkness, with one riding on a scooter up to an Airbus Voyager and spraying paint into its jet engine.

South East counter terrorism police have now arrested a 29-year-old woman of no fixed abode and two men, aged 36 and 24, both from London, on terror charges.

A 41-year-old woman, of no fixed abode, was arrested on suspicion of assisting an offender.

The suspects aged 24, 29 and 36 are suspected of "the commission, preparation or instigation of acts of terrorism, contrary to Section 41 of the Terrorism Act 2000", police said.

The arrests took place in Newbury, Berkshire, and all suspects remain in custody.

South East counter-terror police gave no further details about the individuals arrested, nor their suspected link to the incident.

The government has said it will proscribe Palestine Action following the incident at Brize Norton, making it illegal to be a member or invite support for the group.

Home Secretary Yvette Cooper said a draft proscription order would be laid before Parliament on 30 June.

Palestine Action said its activists were able to evade security and claimed they had put two air-to-air refuelling tankers "out of service".

The group said activists used repurposed fire extinguishers to spray the paint and caused "further damage" using crowbars.

However, Downing Street said the incident had not blocked any planned aircraft movements or stopped any operations.

The base is encircled by a large perimeter fence, with security camera and sensors in the area in addition to manned security checkpoints. Patrols around the base are also carried out from time to time.

But a defence source said these measures would not have been able to provide complete cover around the large airbase.

Defence Secretary John Healey said he was "really disturbed" by the incident and ordered a wider security review of all UK military bases.

Prime Minister Sir Keir Starmer condemned the break-in as "disgraceful", characterising it as an "act of vandalism".

COUNTER-TERRORISM POLICE ARREST FOUR PEOPLE AFTER RED PAINT SPRAYED ON MILITARY PLANES

Counter-terrorism police have arrested four people in connection to the protest by Palestine Action at RAF Brize Norton, in which two activists on scooters spray painted two British military planes with red paint and evaded security and police.

Three have been arrested on suspicion of the commission, preparation or instigation of acts of terrorism. Another was arrested of assisting an offender.

The embarrassment caused to the government by the recent Palestine Action incursion at Brize Norton, has led rapidly to the announced proscription of

Palestine Action. Keir Starmer explicitly referred to the spray-painting of the planes as "vandalism", not 'terrorism' and many Parliamentarians including former Justice Secretary Lord Falconer, have stated that the protest may be criminal damage, but not terrorism.

Former First Minister of Scotland Humza Yousaf MSP writes in an opinion piece that "proscribing Palestine Action as a terrorist organisation is a shameful and dangerous misuse of anti-terror legislation by the UK Government". Leading legal and human rights organisations Amnesty UK and Liberty have described the threat to proscribe Palestine Action as "a shocking escalation of the Government's crackdown on protest" and have urged the Home Secretary to abandon the proposal.

Keir Starmer was directly involved in defending one of the Fairford Five, who attempted to put military aircraft at RAF Fairford out of action, at the start of the Iraq War in 2003. Starmer's client, who had planned to set fire to the planes, was acquitted after he argued that he was attempting to prevent an illegal war.

From 1981 to 2000, protestors disrupted RAF Greenham Common, frequently breaking into the grounds, by cutting or ripping down fences, and climbing on top of missile silos. In 2016 and 2017, activists from the Ploughshares movement disarmed war planes bound for Indonesia and Saudi Arabia, being acquitted in both cases. When protestors broke into RAF Mildenhall in 2017, and RAF Yeovilton in 2020, they were charged with trespass.

Today's arrest is the first time that counter-terror powers have been used in relation to a protest at a British military base. The use of counter-terrorism laws mean that anyone arrested will be kept incommunicado, potentially held in solitary confinement, and questioned, for several days, without being charged.

A spokesperson for Palestine Action said:

"The fact this arrest has taken place before the proposed proscription has been voted on, further demonstrates that proscription is not about enabling prosecutions under terrorism laws – it's about cracking down on non-violent protests which disrupt the flow of arms to Israel during its genocide in Palestine. Proscribing Palestine Action is a political gesture to satisfy pro-Israel groups and arms companies who have been lobbying for us to be banned because we're hitting their profits and having an real impact on Israel's war machine."

"In response to widespread condemnation of the Government's proposed proscription of Palestine Action from the leading human rights organisations among others, the Home Secretary claimed it was an accumulation of actions which led to her assessment rather than a knee-jerk reaction by a humiliated Government.

"However, this arrest confirms they are treating red paint on military planes as an act of terrorism, despite the fact that the same action by protesters for decades – including the protester Keir Starmer defended – has never been treated as terrorism. The only difference is that this time it was done for Palestine and this Government is in the pocket of the weapons companies arming Israel's war crimes."

At the time of the action, Palestine Action said:

"Despite publicly condemning the Israeli government, Britain continues to send military cargo, fly spy planes over Gaza and refuel US/Israeli fighter jets. Britain isn't just complicit, it's an active participant in the Gaza genocide and war crimes across the Middle East.

By decommissioning two military planes, Palestine Action have directly intervened in the genocide and prevented crimes against the Palestinian people."

As legal and human rights experts have made clear, this would be an entirely unprecedented and extremely dangerous kneejerk reaction to rank protest groups who engage in non-violent direct action as "terrorists" and treat them the same as ISIS, National Action, or Boko Haram.

The non-violent action on Friday 20th June saw activists spray paint two RAF aircraft, which was the first time the group had taken any action regarding RAF or on British military land or infrastructure. There is a decades-long history of protest activity, including acts of trespass, criminal damage, sabotage, and more, by activists at British military sites – none of whom have been branded as "terrorists".

In 2004, Keir Starmer defended a man who broke into an RAF base and attempted to set fire to military aircraft, arguing in Court that the activists' actions were justified because they were to stop an 'illegal war.' Palestine Action now faces proscription for the same protest action which Starmer had defended as legal – this time using only paint, not fire. This would mean those who "join" or express support for Palestine Action could face sentences of up to 14 years in prison. In 2023, then Policing Minister Chris Philp stated that "Palestine Action does not meet the threshold for proscription as they do not commit, participate in, prepare for promote, encourage, or otherwise be concerned with acts of terrorism."



Two more people arrested over damage to aircraft at RAF base

Palestine Action has claimed responsibility for damage to two aircraft at RAF Brize Norton in Oxfordshire on 20 June. Sir Keir Starmer condemned the "act of vandalism" as "disgraceful".

Two more people have been arrested on suspicion of a terror offence after two aircraft were vandalised at RAF Brize Norton in Oxfordshire.

Counter Terrorism Policing South East said the men, aged 22 and 24 and both from London, were arrested on Saturday afternoon on suspicion of the commission, preparation or instigation of acts of terrorism, contrary to Section 41 of the Terrorism Act 2000.

On Thursday, police said a woman, aged 29 of no fixed address, and two men, aged 36 and 24 from London, had been taken into police custody after the incident at RAF Brize Norton on 20 June.

The group posted a video online claiming it was behind the **vandalism at the Oxfordshire airbase** last Friday, saying activists had damaged two military planes at the base.

Palestine Action - which focuses its campaigns on multinational arms dealers and has previously **targeted corporate banks** - said two activists "broke into the largest air force base in Britain and used electric scooters to swiftly manoeuvre towards the planes".

Repurposed fire extinguishers were used to spray red paint into the turbine engines of two Airbus Voyagers, while further damage was made using crowbars.

"Red paint, symbolising Palestinian bloodshed was also sprayed across the runway and a Palestine flag was left on the scene," a statement by the group said.

Brize Norton is the largest RAF station, with approximately 5,800 service personnel, 300 civilian staff and 1,200 contractors.

A security review was launched across the "whole defence estate" following the breach, which was condemned as "absolutely staggering" by Ben Obese-Jecty, a Tory MP and former Army officer.

Sir Keir Starmer condemned the "act of vandalism" as "disgraceful", adding: "Our Armed Forces represent the very best of Britain and put their lives on the line for us every day. It is our responsibility to support those who defend us."

Home Secretary Yvette Cooper said on Monday that Palestine Action will be proscribed as a terrorist organisation following the breach at RAF Brize Norton.

She said a draft proscription order will be laid in parliament next week, and if passed, it will make it illegal to be a member of, or invite support for, Palestine Action.



The Terrorism Act 2000 (Proscribed Organisations) (Amendment) Order 2025

Made

Coming into force in accordance with article 1(2)

The Secretary of State makes this Order in exercise of the powers conferred by section 3(3) (a) and (c) of the Terrorism Act 2000(1).

The Secretary of State believes that the organisations to be added to Schedule 2 to that Act by article 2 of this Order are concerned in terrorism(2).

In accordance with section 123(4)(a) of that Act, a draft of this Order has been laid before and approved by a resolution of each House of Parliament.

Citation, commencement and extent

- **1.**—(1) This Order may be cited as the Terrorism Act 2000 (Proscribed Organisations) (Amendment) Order 2025.
 - (2) This Order comes into force on the day after the day on which it is made.
 - (3) This Order extends to the United Kingdom.

Proscribed Organisations

2. In Schedule 2 to the Terrorism Act 2000 (proscribed organisations), after the entry for "Terrorgram collective" (3), insert—

"Palestine Action

Maniacs Murder Cult (MMC) (MKU) (MKY)

Russian Imperial Movement (RIM) (RID), including Russian Imperial Legion (RIL)".

Note on Proscribed Organisation

3. In Schedule 2 to the Terrorism Act 2000 (proscribed organisations), at the end of the note to the Schedule, insert—

"The entry for Palestine Action refers to the organisation using that name that is based in the United Kingdom.".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order)

Part 2 of the Terrorism Act 2000 (c. 11) makes provision for proscribed organisations (including setting out offences in relation to such organisations in sections 11 to 13). An organisation is proscribed if it is listed in Schedule 2 to that Act ("Schedule 2") or, in most cases, it operates under the same name as an organisation so listed (section 3(1)).

Article 2 of this Order adds Palestine Action, Maniacs Murder Cult and Russian Imperial Movement to the list in Schedule 2 as new entries.

Article 3 of this Order adds a note to Schedule 2 providing that the entry for the first organisation added to Schedule 2 by article 2 of this Order is the organisation using that name that is based in the United Kingdom.

A full impact assessment has not been produced for this instrument as no, or no significant, impact on the private, voluntary or public sectors is foreseen.

- "Terrorism" has the meaning given by section 1(1) of the Terrorism Act 2000, and section 1(1) was amended by the Terrorism Act 2006 (c. 11) and the Counter-Terrorism Act 2008 (c. 28).

UPON the Claimant's application for judicial review dated 27 June 2025;

AND UPON the Claimant's urgent application for interim relief dated 27 June 2025 ("the interim relief application");

AND UPON hearing leading counsel for the Claimant and leading counsel for the Defendant at a case management hearing on 30 June 2025;

IT IS ORDERED THAT:

Interim Relief Application

- 1. The interim relief application is to be determined after a hearing at 10.30am on Friday 4 July 2025, with a time estimate of 3 hours (not including judgment).
- 2. The Defendant must file any evidence and submissions (to stand as a skeleton argument) in respect of the interim relief application by 4pm on Tuesday 1 July 2025.
- 3. The submissions filed pursuant to paragraph 2 above must address inter alia the form of interim relief which the Defendant considers would be effective to suspend the effect of any order to proscribe Palestine Action made prior to the hearing of the interim relief application.
- 4. The Claimant must file any reply evidence and updated submissions (to stand as a skeleton argument) in respect of the interim relief application by 4pm on Wednesday 2 July 2025.

- 5. The parties are to agree the contents of a paginated and indexed bundle containing all relevant documents required for the hearing, and of a paginated and indexed bundle containing all authorities on which the parties intend to rely. This is to be filed in electronic and hard copy form, in accordance with the guidance in the Administrative Court Judicial Review Guide, by 12 noon Thursday 3 July 2025.
- 6. Any requests for directions concerning the transmission of the hearing of the interim relief application are to be received by 4pm Thursday 3 July 2025.
- 7. Any application by a non-party under CPR 5.4C(2) for permission to obtain from the records of the Court a copy of documents filed in these proceedings prior to the hearing of the interim relief application:
 - (a) must be sent to the Administrative Court, copied to the Clerk to Mr Justice Chamberlain at Danielle.Jarvis@justice.gov.uk; and
 - (b) the Defendant must make any submissions in response to the application within 3 hours of receiving the application.

Further directions

- 8. A hearing to determine whether to grant permission to apply for judicial review is to be listed on a date to be fixed in the week commencing 21 July 2025, after consultation with counsels' clerks, with a time estimate of 1 day.
- 9. At the same time as filing submissions pursuant to paragraph 2 above, the Defendant must:
- (a) indicate whether the Defendant intends to make any application for a declaration under section 6 of the Justice and Security Act 2013 and for permission under section 8; and
- (b) if such an application is to be made, propose a timetable for the making and hearing of that application.

Liberty to apply and costs

- 10. The parties have liberty to apply.
- 11. Costs in the interim relief application.



About the case

The Home Secretary has announced her plans to proscribe Palestine Action as a terrorist organisation, which would be an unprecedented attack on civil liberties and the right to protest.

What is Palestine Action?

Palestine Action is a network of activists which have used direct action to expose and target property and premises connected to war crimes in Palestine. It was formed approximately 5 years ago and has used a range of tactics, including direct action, to disrupt the operations of Elbit Systems, Israel's largest arms firm. Elbit Systems is directly implicated in grave crimes against Palestinians including offences under the International Criminal Courts Act 2003.

The campaign to proscribe Palestine Action

For years, pro-Israel lobby groups, the Israeli government and Elbit Systems have been lobbying for repressive treatment of Palestine Action. Just days before government sources told the press of their intentions to ban the direct-action group, 'We Believe in Israel' released a report and 'Campaign Against Antisemitism' wrote to the Home Secretary asking for her to proscribe us.

Now, the Home Secretary is trying to rush through a vote in Parliament to make joining or supporting Palestine Action a terrorist offence. If they're successful, it would rank Palestine Action amongst ISIS and National Action, despite our actions being in line with a long history of direct-action protests targeting property and weapons linked to war crimes.

The legal fight back

Palestine Action has received an outpouring of support in response to the government's attempts to proscribe us for which, we couldn't be more grateful.

We hope you will support us in fighting this draconian attack on our movement.





Exposed: Where Palestine Action plans to strike next

Telegraph uncovers major recruitment drive days before group is proscribed as terrorist organisation

Palestine Action is preparing to attack targets across the country including RAF bases and a drone factory.

In a meeting recorded by Telegraph reporters, the group outlined a list of new targets after its members damaged planes during a break-in at RAF Brize Norton last week.

Palestine Action has launched a major recruitment drive just days before it is <u>officially proscribed as a terrorist organisation</u>, putting it on a par with Hamas, al-Qaeda and Islamic State.

The Telegraph was able to access one of its online meetings and can, for the first time, disclose details about the group's secretive structure, its new focus on covert action, and advice given to members on exploiting the legal aid system following any arrest.

The meeting's organiser boasted that its activists ranged from "nursery teachers to surgeons", aged from 18 to 80.

Tactics discussed included breaking into factories and hitting "everything you can find with a sledgehammer", as well as how to set up autonomous cells able to target military bases without detection.

A slide in the call identified three RAF bases most suitable for attack: RAF Cranwell and RAF Barkston Heath, both in Lincolnshire, and RAF Valley, in Anglesey, North Wales. It also recommended action against defence companies believed to be supplying arms to Israel, including a drone factory in Leicester.

The Telegraph has shared details of the plans with police and the Ministry of Defence.

Palestine Action triggered a major security review of military bases after breaking into Brize Norton, where it sprayed red paint on two military planes and potentially caused millions of pounds of damage.

Yvette Cooper, the Home Secretary, called the attack "disgraceful" and vowed to proscribe the group. Palestine Action said it would mount a legal challenge against that decision.

In the wake of the announcement, the group has been carrying out an intensive series of recruitment workshops in an attempt to build a network of autonomous cells across the country that will target military bases.

RAF Cranwell was the world's first Air Academy and it continues to select and train the next generation of RAF officers. RAF Barkston Heath is a relief landing ground for RAF Cranwell and is the home of 57 Sqn's B Flight of No 3 Flying Training School. RAF Valley on Anglesey is home to No 4 Flying Training School, responsible for training the UK's next generation of fighter pilots.

All three bases are said by Palestine Action to have links to <u>Elbit Systems UK</u>, a military manufacturer that has been repeatedly targeted by the group.

Other targets listed included UAV Tactical Systems, a drone company owned by Elbit.

At the start of the online "direct action workshop", an unidentified female activist told the group of around 50 potential recruits that they would be required to make "sacrifices" for the cause.

The participants were told they would be part of a new, sustained wave of attacks targeting military bases.

The organiser said that the proposed proscription was "draconian and dangerous" and Palestine Action would "continue to operate" even if designated as a terror group.

She was standing in front of a flag associated with the YPJ an all-female militia involved in the Syrian civil war whose members are mostly Kurdish.



New members were asked to download the encrypted messaging app Signal and were told they would be messaged by anonymous organisers at some point after the workshop.

After being contacted, the new recruits would be divided into cells which could plot their own actions.

Among those said to be in the meeting were university lecturers and a clergyman.

Instructions to download Signal, create a unique username and send it discreetly to a member of Palestine Action proved a struggle for some of the older participants.

The division of the groups into individual autonomous units is a deliberate strategy to prevent leaders of the organisation being arrested in connection with various plots, as has happened in the case of other protest groups, such as Extinction Rebellion.



In an article published in April, <u>Huda Ammori</u>, the group's co-founder, said it had deliberately been structured to prevent those in leadership roles from being detained.

She said: "By being security-conscious and working in small groups, we can make it difficult for the authorities to respond to individual actions by targeting the movement as a whole – such that Palestine Action can continue to grow, even in hostile conditions."

Ms Ammori, who previously supported the Palestine Solidarity Campaign, founded the group in 2020 alongside <u>Richard Barnard</u>, 51, a former member of Extinction Rebellion.

The 31-year-old was born in Bolton to a Palestinian father, a surgeon, and an Iraqi mother. She graduated from the University of Manchester with an international business and finance degree.

Legal warnings

The recruits were told that they must be aware of the legal ramifications of their actions, but were advised they could benefit from a free lawyer under government rules if arrested.

The group was shown a list of the potential punishments they could receive for specific actions.

For a "locking offence", where one locks themselves onto property and refuses to move, they could expect up to six months in prison.

Aggravated trespass would lead to three months and a £2,500 fine, as would causing criminal damage under £5,000.

Criminal damage that was over £5,000 could lead to a 10-year sentence, while burglary charges would lead to a similar sentence.

The organiser said: "The conviction and courage it takes to take this action in the first place is accepting that level of sacrifice."

She said there were currently 19 members of the group in prison and boasted that activists consisted of everyone from "nursery teachers to surgeons" and "from 18 to 80-year-olds".

She added: "As much as we can stand by our morals and our ethics, we have to know for a fact we have to be well informed that there are risks that we are taking – that is both legal consequences especially as time has gone on, things have gotten worse in the legal framework and what results we are getting in the courtrooms, but also psychologically and financially."

The organiser did not mention the fact that if Palestine Action is proscribed, anyone who is a member of the group or expresses support for it would face sentences of up to 14 years in prison.

All of the recruits were read out an "actions agreement", in which it was stated: "Each individual takes part in the movement from their own free will.

"We encourage all to join but we do not pressure people into doing things that make them uncomfortable."

Recruits were warned that if they were arrested, Palestine Action would not pay their legal fees but would offer "support".

An "arrest support group" would be on hand to help those detained and recruits were told that if they did not have enough money to pay legal costs, they could rely on legal aid.

The organiser said: "We do not use duty solicitors. [Our lawyers] will apply for legal aid on your behalf if eligible.

"And everybody, as I said, even if you're a millionaire, you get free legal advice in the police station."

Covert action

Outlining the various strategies for attacking targets, the organiser said that the plan was to carry out sustained, serious disruption.

In the past the group had focused on carrying out "accountable" attacks with the aim of getting caught and raising publicity.

The focus for the new recruits is on carrying out covert actions and escaping undetected. They were told not to take phones on raids and to hand over their belongings to neighbours in case their homes were searched if they were arrested.



The organiser said: "There is obviously a risk of getting arrested but the aim is not to get arrested.

"It means covering up anything that might make you identifiable, doing the action at a certain time, making sure it is as quick as possible, and essentially trying to get away at the end of it."

She said that the actions could be categorised as low risk, mid risk, high risk and extra high risk.

She added: "Essentially, whether it's locking yourself on, whether it's getting up on a factory and, starting to hit everything that you can find with the sledgehammer and everything in between, whether it's being in front of the gates... we've seen so many examples of this, there are so many different ways of disrupting."

The recruits were told not to speak about actions to anyone outside the group or to share the identity of anyone participating in attacks.

"We do not provide police with any information that may compromise activists, actions or the movement... cause comes first", the organiser added.

Palestine Action: We're spreading 'intifada' in prisons

A Ministry of Defence spokesman said: "The UK's defence estate is vital to our national security and this government will not tolerate those who put that security at risk.

"This Government is taking the strong step of proscribing Palestine Action due to its activities, which are a threat to our national security."

A spokesman for North Wales Police said: "Our officers continue to liaise with MoD staff in relation to security matters at RAF Valley, Anglesey.

"The emergence of potential threats to the site is recognised, with the need for additional policing and security patrols kept under regular review."

Lincolnshire Police has been contacted for comment.

Following the spray-painting of two British war planes at RAF Brize Norton on Friday, Home Secretary Yvette Cooper made the dramatic announcement that she planned to initiate the proscription of Palestine Action in Parliament today. The attempt to ban a political protest group, and effectively brand them a 'terrorist' organisation, is unprecedented.

Civil liberties organisations and campaign groups immediately issued strong statements condemning the move. Liberty said, "Targeting a protest group with terrorism powers in this way is a shocking escalation of the Government's crackdown on protest, and we urge the Home Secretary to rethink. This move would be a huge step change in how counter-terror laws are applied. The actions of Palestine Action don't meet Govt's own proportionality test to be proscribed."

Amnesty International UK said, "We're deeply concerned at the use of counter terrorism powers to target protest groups. Terrorism powers should never have been used [against] Palestine Action activists, and they certainly shouldn't be used to ban them."

The phrase 'We are all Palestine Action' spread across social media, and was chanted at Pro-Palestine protests on Saturday. A long list of civil liberties and campaign groups are supporting the demonstration today, including Campaign Against the Arms Trade, Code Pink, Sisters Uncut, the Muslim Association of Britain, Healthworkers & Allies 4 Palestine, and CAGE.

Metropolitan Police Commissioner Mark Rowley issued a nakedly political statement in advance of the planned Palestine Action protest outside Parliament. Referring to Palestine Action as an "organised extremist political group", he claimed that "actions in support of such a group go beyond what most would see as legitimate protest." Rowley announced Public Order Conditions using Section 14 of the Public Order Act to create a huge exclusion zone around Westminster, effectively banning the protest. In response, the protest moved to Trafalgar Square.

Despite Rowley's intimidatory statement, heavy-handed policing, and the last minute change of venue, thousands still gathered in support of Palestine Action. They chanted "We are all Palestine Action" and "We won't be intimidated". Police aggression, given license by Rowley, was not long in coming, with protestors being assaulted, grabbed from the crowd, and dragged away under arrest. According to reports, at least eight protestors appear to have been arrested.

Speaking at the demonstration, in relation to the ban on protesting outside Parliament, a Palestine Action spokesperson stated, "It's really troubling that the head of the Met would pre-empt the government and ban us from protesting. It's a frustrating turn for democracy in this country.

Another added: "Providing military and arms supports for a state committing genocide, while detaining and outlawing the activists opposing their complicity: this is naked authoritarianism."

Another Palestine Action support demonstration is being held today at St Peter's Square, Manchester, starting at 6pm.

In earlier news, activists from Palestine Action visited the UK offices of Invesco Ltd at Henley-on-Thames covering the premises in symbolic blood-red paint, and leaving the message 'Drop Elbit'. Invesco are an American-owned international investment company, who hold over \$126 Million in shares in Elbit Systems, Israel's biggest weapons company.

The group previously stated, in response to the Home Secretary's announcement: "On Monday, Yvette Cooper is due to tell Parliament that she will be banning Palestine Action, but Palestine Action is every person who opposes genocide and the Israeli war machine. We represent every person who believes that Palestinian lives are worth more than the tools used to kill them. The terrorists are those facilitating the daily massacres of Palestinians – not those taking action to stop them."



Palestine Action group to be banned, home secretary confirms



Hundreds demonstrated in Trafalgar Square ahead of the announcement on Monday, after police blocked protesters from gathering outside Parliament

Home Secretary Yvette Cooper has said she will proscribe Palestine Action under anti-terror law.

It comes days after activists from the group broke into RAF Brize Norton in Oxfordshire and spray-painted two military planes red - an incident Cooper called "disgraceful".

The move effectively brands the group a terrorist organisation and, if passed in Parliament, would make membership of and support of the group illegal.

Palestine Action called the government's action "unhinged".

Cooper's announcement came as Palestine Action held a protest in central London, with hundreds in attendance and thirteen arrested as scuffles broke out.

Announcing her intention to ban the group, Cooper said Palestine Action had a "long history of unacceptable criminal damage".

"The UK's defence enterprise is vital to the nation's national security and this Government will not tolerate those that put that security at risk," she added.

Counter-terrorism police are leading the investigation into <u>Friday's incident at</u> Brize Norton.

In a statement, Palestine Action said: "The real crime here is not red paint being sprayed on these war planes, but the war crimes that have been enabled with those planes because of the UK Government's complicity in Israel's genocide."

"We are teachers, nurses, students and parents who take part in actions disrupting the private companies who are arming Israel's genocide, by spray painting or entering their factory premises. It is plainly preposterous to rank us with terrorist groups like ISIS, National Action and Boko Haram", it said.

"We have instructed lawyers who are pursuing all avenues for legal challenge."

Israel has strongly denied allegations of genocide relating to the ongoing war in Gaza.

Cooper will lay the draft order before Parliament next week.

If passed, the ban would make it a criminal offence to belong to or support the group, punishable by up to 14 years in prison.

Cooper said in a written statement: "This decision is specific to Palestine Action and does not affect lawful protest groups and other organisations campaigning on issues around Palestine or the Middle East.

"It is vitally important that those seeking to protest peacefully, including pro-Palestinian groups, those opposing the actions of the Israeli government, and those demanding changes in the UK's foreign policy, can continue to do so."

She added that the group had committed several acts of serious damage since it was created in 2020, costing more than £1m in damage.

In 2022, <u>the group broke into Thales defence factory in Glasgow</u>, setting off pyrotechnics and throwing a smoke bomb into an area where staff were being evacuated.

The damage at the site was estimated at £1,130,783.

Cooper also referenced two incidents last year, when seven Palestine Action members were arrested for aggravated burglary at the Instro Precision factory in Kent, while several others broke into the Bristol HQ of Elbit Systems UK.

"I have considered carefully the nature and scale of Palestine Action's activity. Proscription represents a legitimate response to the threat posed by Palestine Action," Cooper added.

Former Scottish First Minister, Humza Yousaf, told the BBC's Scotcast podcast Cooper's action to ban Palestine Action is a "shameful abuse of anti-terror legislation".

He added that it is an "utterly ludicrous overreaction by the United Kingdom [government] in an attempt to intimidate and ultimately silence protestors and pro-Palestinian protesters".

Nadia Whittome, Labour MP for Nottingham East, said: "We should all be concerned about plans to proscribe Palestine Action as a terrorist group. It sets a dangerous precedent, which governments in future could further use against their critics."

Chancellor Rachel Reeves condemned Palestine Action's behaviour as "totally unacceptable".

"To cause damage to military assets, but also to cause such damage to privately owned assets, it is unacceptable whatever your views are on what's happening in the Middle East," she said ahead of Cooper's statement.

Hundreds of people met at Trafalgar Square after police banned them from protesting outside of Parliament.

Organisers made the last-minute venue change after Scotland Yard enforced an exclusion zone across much of Westminster.

Metropolitan Police chief Sir Mark Rowley said while the force had no legal power to stop the protest, they would impose the conditions "robustly".

Charing Cross, next to Trafalgar Square, was blocked for a time as the protesters gathered.

Some supporters of the group waved Palestinian flags and carried placards, with other protesters chanting: "We will not be silenced."

The protest was required to end at 15:00 BST, when police moved in to disperse the crowd.

The Met Police said it made 13 arrests at the protest.

Six of these were for assaulting an emergency worker, one for a racially aggravated public order offence, four for refusing to disperse, and two were held for obstructing a constable in the execution of their duty, the Met said.

DESPITE OUR COLLECTIVE EFFORTS TO STOP THE PROSCRIPTION OF PALESTINE ACTION, THE BAN WILL COME IN AT MIDNIGHT

In five years, we have managed to build a direct action movement which successfully disrupted and challenged the Israeli weapons industry. Through relentless actions and the willingness to sacrifice our liberty, we've forced shut three Israeli weapons factories, pressured over a dozen companies to cut ties with Elbit Systems and cost the Israeli weapons maker £billions in lost contracts. The most important victory is building an effective global movement in service of the Palestinian people.

It's clear, we were too effective and the government had to impose the most draconian attack on civil liberties to please the pro-Israel lobby. They may be able to proscribe 'Palestine Action', but they can not stop direct action happening across the country in different forms. We are more than just a name, or a network, we are an idea that can never be stopped. To be clear, they can not proscribe the TACTIC of direct action for Palestine.

We are extremely grateful for all of the support we have received over the past few years, and the outpouring of solidarity since the intention to proscribe us was announced. This proscription CAN NOT go unchallenged, and we are pleased to see many who are adamant on resisting the ban through a campaign of civil disobedience.

Breaking unjust laws is a moral duty. Unaffiliated campaign groups, Defend Our Juries and 'we do not comply' (wedonotcomply.org), will lead on defiance of the ban and resist the extreme counter-terror laws imposed on all of us. It is a given that there will be resistance.

Police arrest 29 protesters on suspicion of terror offences after Palestine Action banned

The protest group was officially classified as a terrorist organisation from midnight on Saturday after the measure received overwhelming support from MPs and following the failure of a last-minute legal challenge to delay it.

Police have arrested 29 protesters on suspicion of terror offences after a ban on the Palestine Action group came into effect.

The protest group was **officially proscribed as a terrorist organisation** from midnight on Saturday after a last-minute legal challenge at the Court of Appeal to delay it failed.

The Metropolitan Police said on Saturday afternoon that the protesters had been held on suspicion of committing offences under the Terrorism Act 2000 following a protest in London's Parliament Square.

"The group is now proscribed and expressing support for them is a criminal offence," the force added. "Arrests are being made."

MPs overwhelmingly **voted in favour** of Home Secretary Yvette Cooper's decision to ban the protest group under the legislation **on Wednesday** and the House of Lords approved the move the following day.

The law change adds **Palestine Action** to the list of banned organisations along with the likes of al Qaeda, ISIS and Hezbollah, and makes membership of, or support for, the direct action group a criminal offence punishable by up to 14 years in prison.

Even wearing a T-shirt or badge with the group's name on attracts a maximum six-month sentence.

On Saturday, a large number of Metropolitan Police officers circled around dozens of protesters carrying placards that said: "I oppose genocide. I support Palestine Action."

Israel has strongly denied any allegations of genocide.

Campaign group Defend Our Juries said demonstrators were set to gather in Parliament Square on Saturday holding signs supporting Palestine Action.



Officers who attended the protest were met with cries of "Met Police you are puppets of the Zionist state" and "leave them alone".

Others were heard shouting, "British police off our streets", and "from the river to the sea, Palestine will be free".

Chants of "shame" were directed at police.

A woman seen lying on the floor in handcuffs was carried away by officers and put in a police van.

She was heard saying: "Free Palestine, stop the genocide, I oppose genocide, I support the rights of the Palestinian people, I support freedom of speech, I support freedom of assembly."

A large group of people crowded around to film the scene.

Officers placed her in a vehicle before returning to the square's Mahatma Gandhi statue.

The protest started at about 1.10pm and officers were seen taking people away shortly after 1.30pm. Most of the officers dispersed at around 2.10pm.

'Creeping totalitarianism'

Leslie Tate, 76, a Green councillor from Hertfordshire, said the group is not a violent organisation, and the proscription is wrong, adding the protest

was "necessary to defend our democracy, and this is the creeping edge of totalitarianism".

Among those removed by police was Reverend Sue Parfitt, who is 83.

Ms Cooper announced plans to proscribe Palestine Action after **two Voyager aircraft were allegedly damaged at RAF Brize Norton in Oxfordshire on 20 June**, which police said caused around £7m worth of damage.

Even wearing a T-shirt or badge with the group's name on attracts a maximum six-month sentence.

On Friday, the High Court heard the decision to ban the group was taken before the aircraft were allegedly damaged and as early as March this year.

Huda Ammori, the co-founder of Palestine Action, is seeking to bring a legal challenge against the Home Office with a hearing for permission to bring a judicial review set to take place during the week of 21 July.

"The merits of the underlying decision to proscribe a particular group is not a matter for the court... Similarly, it is not a matter for this court to express any views on whether or not the allegations or claims made by Palestine Action are right or wrong."

27 ARRESTED FOR TERRORISM ACT OFFENCES IN PARLIAMENT SQUARE

A group of 27 people, including a priest, an Emeritus Professor and a number of health professionals, have been arrested in Parliament Square for offences under the Terrorism Act.

They were sitting by the statue of Gandhi, holding home-made cardboard signs, saying:

"I oppose genocide. I support Palestine Action".

Had they done the same thing yesterday, few would have noticed, but today the Government's new order came into force, proscribing Palestine Action as a 'terrorist' organisation. Palestine Action is a direct action group which aims to stop arms being trafficked from the UK to support the genocide in Gaza, including by using red spray paint to protest against the use of RAF planes in supporting the Israeli military.

It is now an offence under the Terrorism Act to express support for Palestine Action.

Yesterday, the group wrote to the Met Commissioner, Sir Mark Rowley, to warn of their action [1]:

"We would like to alert you to the fact we may be committing offences under the Terrorism Act tomorrow, Saturday 5 July, in Parliament Square at about 1pm.

We do not intend to cause you any alarm. We are committed to nonviolence and there is no risk whatsoever of anyone being harmed."

A spokesperson for Defend Our Juries said:

"We commend the Counter Terrorism police for their decisive action in protecting the people of London from some cardboard signs opposing the genocide in Gaza and expressing support for those taking action to prevent it. It's a relief to know that Counter Terrorism police have nothing better to do"

Further such actions are expected to follow shortly.



More than 70 arrests at protests over Palestine Action ban

Demonstrations are held in London, Manchester, Cardiff and Leeds over the group being added to a list of proscribed terrorist groups.

More than 70 people have been arrested at protests against Palestine Action being designated a proscribed terrorist group.

Protesters gathered for the second week in a row in central **London**, where the Metropolitan Police made 42 arrests.

Other demonstrations took place around the UK, including in **Manchester**, where police said 16 arrests were made, in Cardiff, where South Wales Police arrested 13 people, and in Leeds, where West Yorkshire Police made one arrest.

In London, two groups of protesters gathered underneath statues of Mahatma Gandhi and Nelson Mandela in Parliament Square, shortly before 1pm.

They wrote the message "I oppose genocide, I support Palestine Action" on pieces of cardboard and silently held the signs in the air as they were surrounded by police officers and members of the media.

Some demonstrators could be seen lying on top of each other on the floor as police searched their bags, and took their ID cards and signs.

Officers then carried away a number of protesters, lifting them off the ground and into waiting police vans.

The last protester was lifted from the Nelson Mandela statue shortly after 2.30pm.

Forty-one of the 42 arrests at the London protest were for showing support for a proscribed organisation, while one person was arrested for common assault, the Met Police said.

Palestine Action's terror group designation means membership of, or support for, the group is a criminal offence punishable by up to 14 years in prison.

Greater Manchester Police said it had arrested 16 people under the Terrorism Act 2000 after responding to a protest in St Peter's Square at around 2.30pm.

South Wales Police confirmed 13 people were arrested on suspicion of offences under the same act in the vicinity of Central Square in Cardiff.

West Yorkshire Police said a person was arrested in Leeds on suspicion of demonstrating support for Palestine Action.

The Met Police arrested 29 people at a similar protest last weekend.

Scotland Yard has said its stance remains that officers will act where criminal offences, including support of proscribed groups or organisations, are committed.

It added that this includes "chanting, wearing clothing or displaying articles such as flags, signs or logos".

Three women have been arrested under the Terrorism Act after a van was driven into an Edinburgh-based defence company's fence.

Police Scotland said the three women - aged 31, 34 and 42 - were arrested after a disturbance in the Crewe Road North area of **Edinburgh** on Tuesday.

The force said a van was driven into an external fence of a business premises, and that its Counter Terrorism Unit was leading the investigation.

It added: "Enquiries are ongoing. We are treating this as targeted, and we do not believe there is any wider threat to the public."

Direct action campaign group Shut Down Leonardo - which said it aims to target aerospace, defence and security company Leonardo's headquarters in Edinburgh - posted a photo of the van.

It shows police on the roof of the vehicle, which has a Palestine flag hanging off the back.

Shut Down Leonardo claims the factory makes components for Israel's F-35 fighter jets.

A Leonardo spokesperson told the PA news agency: "Leonardo UK is subject to UK government export controls and does not supply equipment direct to Israel.

"The right to peaceful protest is an important principle in our society, however, aggressive and violent activity should have no place in protest.

"The intimidation of our people, who work hard to support the security and defence of the UK, is not acceptable.

"Our main customer is the UK Armed Forces. We are proud to manufacture technology that supports our service personnel and helps keep them safe. Their dedication underpins the freedom on which our society is based."

Palestine Action - now proscribed as a terrorist group - had also targeted Leonardo's Edinburgh site, cutting off the electricity supply to the factory in March.



Women enjoying a hen party took time out to show support to 49 peaceful sign-holders as they were carried to police vans in London.

In Manchester, 16 peaceful sign-holders were dragged off the streets as the police violently burst through supportive crowds.

In Caerdydd (Cardiff), 13 peaceful sign-holders were removed from the entrance to the BBC Cymru HQ, their houses raided, and held in cells for over 30hrs, including an 86yr old man who uses two canes to walk.

BRINGING DOWN THE TERRORISM LAWS "WE DO NOT COMPLY"

WHAT IS HAPPENING

The British government has attempted to ban Palestine Action, the direct action network, from operating in England, Wales, Scotland and Occupied Ireland.

From 00:01 on Sat 5th July, direct action network Palestine Action will be classed as a terrorist organisation alongside the likes of ISIS and National Action. This is one of, if not the, most draconian attack of everyone's freedom of speech and right to dissent in this country. We will not comply with unjust laws.

CIVIL DISOBEDIENCE

One may well ask: "How can you advocate breaking some laws and obeying others?" The answer lies in the fact that there are two types of laws: just and unjust. I would be the first to advocate obeying just laws. One has not only a legal, but a moral responsibility to obey just laws. Conversely, one has a moral responsibility to disobey unjust laws. I would agree with St. Augustine that "an unjust law is no law at all."

• Martin Luther King, Jr.

THE PLAN

We will not comply with this unjust law. Many people from celebrities, to artists, to writers, to journalists to activists are intending to break this unjust law. We will do it together. Unjust laws are no laws at all. Mass lawbreaking is the heart of classical civil disobedience. The law you disagree with, you break en-masse.

The most effective, powerful and damaging to the state is mass civil disobedience all together in one place. This has power both visually, from a media perspective and also from a problem for the state. Arresting a mass of people together under terrorism laws will be tricky for them. Equally ignoring them and allowing them to flagrantly flout the law in public is equally undesirable for the state.

There are two different levels of risk.

- In a public place, wear an item of clothing or item that "would arouse reasonable suspicion that they are a member of a proscribed organisation". This means wearing a Palestine Action t-shirt or jumper. Read the legal risks. This can only be tried in the magistrates court and comes with a maximum sentence of 6 months in prison, and the likely outcome if prosecuted would be far less (e.g. fines or conditional discharge).
- Express your explicit support for Palestine Action. <u>Read the legal risks</u>. If this is tried in magistrates, the max sentences is the same as above. The risk here is if the case is moved to crown court the maximum jumps up to 14 years in prison.

Steps to take before you take action

- Print off and bring a bust card with you. See bust cards on GBC's website.
- Clear out tech (laptop, desktop, phone) from your home before taking action. This is to protect all of your friends and family as well as keeping your devices safe from the police
- Bring some money (cash) and a book in case you are arrested.
- Make sure someone is there to film what happens, and send it in to us.

Where and when are people taking action?

Every Saturday, people will be taking action to defy the ban. This will start on the 5th July 2025. On the morning of 5th July 2025, Defend our Juries, who had until this point legally campaigned against the courts crackdown on protest, defied the ban and held placards that read "I oppose genocide. I support Palestine Action". 27 people were arrested under s.13 Terrorism Act 200 which is summary only and will appear in the Magistrates' court, but so far have not been charged.

More than 100 people arrested across UK in series of protests against Palestine Action ban

The direct action group has been designated as a proscribed terrorist organisation by the Home Secretary.

More than 100 people protesting against the ban of Palestine Action have been arrested in towns and cities across the UK.

As well as in London's Parliament Square, demonstrations were also held in Manchester, Edinburgh, Bristol and Truro after the group was officially designated as a proscribed terrorist organisation two weeks ago.

Protesters gathered in Parliament Square in Westminster carrying white placards with the message: "I oppose genocide, I support Palestine Action."

Some were carried away by officers, while others were led away in handcuffs.

The **Metropolitan Police** said in a post on X: "55 people were arrested in Parliament Square for displaying placards in support of Palestine Action, which is a proscribed group."

The arrests were made under Section 13 of the Terrorism Act 2000, which carries a maximum six-month prison sentence.

The force said a further nine people were arrested for supporting Palestine Action within a separate large-scale march to Whitehall on Saturday by the Palestine Coalition.

Greater Manchester Police said it arrested 18 people on suspicion of support of a proscribed organisation, adding that they remained in custody for questioning.

Avon and Somerset Police said 17 people were arrested during a protest in Bristol, while eight people were arrested near Truro Cathedral in Cornwall after protesters gathered to show support for Palestine Action.

'FAST-MOVING' EVENTS DRAW A CROWD IN MANCHESTER

In the pouring rain, a small group of protesters sat silently on stones in front of the Gandhi statue in Manchester city centre.

Within an hour of their arrival, each of them was arrested and taken away in police vans. Not for what they said or chanted, but because of the signs they held.

Handwritten placards with the words "I oppose genocide, I support Palestine Action" - now potentially an offence under the terrorism act.

16 people were swiftly arrested one after the other. Some had to be carried off, while others were led away in handcuffs.

The fast-moving events drew a crowd and were filmed by onlookers on their phones. At one point, a police woman asked people to stand back, so officers could do their jobs. One man shouted, "I wouldn't like it if that was my grandma being arrested."

But the protestors said they came prepared to spend a few hours in the cells. They looked unphased as the van doors were closed behind them.

With a large protest being planned for next month in London, activists say they're willing to break the law again for what they believe in, even if those actions could lead to 14 years in prison.

Seventy people were **arrested at similar demonstrations** in Parliament Square over the past two weekends.

Eight people were arrested near Truro Cathedral under Section 13, Devon and Cornwall Police said, while protesters have also been arrested at a demonstration in Manchester.

Before Saturday's protests, Defend Our Juries, which is coordinating the campaign, said a total of 120 people had previously been arrested across the UK.

The Met warned anyone expressing support for Palestine Action would likely face arrest and that officers would be on the lookout for chants similar to "death to the IDF" led by punk rap duo Bob Vylan at Glastonbury Festival.

Home Secretary Yvette Cooper announced plans to proscribe Palestine Action after two Voyager aircraft were allegedly damaged at RAF Brize Norton in Oxfordshire on 20 June, which police said caused around £7m worth of damage.

The ban means that membership of, or support for, the direct action group is now a criminal offence punishable by up to 14 years in prison, under the Terrorism Act 2000.

Even wearing a T-shirt or badge with the group's name on attracts a maximum six-month sentence.

Huda Ammori, the co-founder of Palestine Action, is seeking to challenge the ban, with a hearing for permission to bring a judicial review set to take place at the High Court on Monday.


